A detresfa was declared when the aircraft failed to arrive at destination. The aircraft wreckage was located by a farm labourer and his wife on 23 March 1999 at approximately 0600 Z, 45nm east of Mmabatho. The aircraft impacted the ground in a slight nose down attitude. The pilot and two passengers were fatally injured. The CAA investigators arrived at the scene at approximately 1645 Z.

Probable Cause

Due to the darkness, adverse weather conditions with no moon and possibly flying in cloud, the pilot may have had no visual reference when he impacted the ground in a fairly level attitude at a fairly high speed, direct on course for Lanseria.
